Complete injury and incident report forms when necessary. • Ensure all participants are following facility rules and policies. • Attend scheduled meetings to discuss ongoing issues and schedule shifts. • Handle on-the-field protests regarding rule interpretation and player eligibility. • Organize and complete paperwork at the end of the duty night, including game sheets, participation numbers and other relevant forms.
